

Listen and repeat:

Север, юг, за́пад и восто́к – это сто́роны света. North, South, West, and East are parts of the world.

Вот – щено́к, а там - щука. Here is a pup and there is a pike fish.

Юпитер – планета. Jupiter is a planet. Я люблю щербет! I love sherbet!

The letter $\mathbf{\Theta}$ \mathbf{o} makes the sound [yu] as in Yule. Yule is an old Scandinavian tradition celebrating the winter solstice.

The letter \mathbf{u} is unique because there is no exact equivalent to its sound in English. Think of it as a long palatalized [sh] sound, the one similar to when you say a fre<u>sh sh</u>erbet but with your tongue a bit farther forward: \mathbf{u} [sh']. Have you noticed that this letter looks similar to the letter \mathbf{u} ? The only difference between them is that \mathbf{u} always sounds hard - [sh], while \mathbf{u} is always soft – [sh']. To pronounce palatalized [sh'], prepare to say [sh] but move your tongue forward to touch your lower teeth. Listen and repeat these syllables:

ша – ща	шу –щу	юш – ющ	ше – ще	юр – рю
аш — ащ	уш — ущ	еш – ещ	юл – лю	юн – ню
ош – ощ	иш – ищ	ши – щи	юз – зю	юд – дю
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
